Note:

- 1). At least 18 semester credit hours of course work (6 of which must be upper division hours in residency) must be completed in order to receive a minor (hours will vary by minor). Students are advised to refer to their catalogue of graduation and to contact an Academic Advisor for information regarding specific minor requirements.
- 2). Minor requirements are comprised of specific courses as outlined in the Undergraduate catalogue. A minor is not a collection of arbitrary courses; students should not assume that because they have numerous hours in one discipline that they qualify for a minor.
- 3). Minor requirements may be used in students' major field of study to satisfy elective hour requirements or Support Work requirements. Students must consult their Academic Advisor in order to make this determination regarding their major-specific degree program.
- 4). Students may pursue up to two minors.
- 5). A grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on all course work used to satisfy the requirements of a minor is required.
- 6). Students may only pursue a minor which is listed in their catalogue of graduation (Students may not declare or complete a minor which does not exist in their catalogue of graduation).
- 7). All minor requirements must be completed at graduation. A minor can not be added to a student's degree program once they have graduated.
- 8). All minors must be officially declared and un-declared (students should contact their Academic Advisor). In the event that an intended minor will not be satisfied at the time of graduation, students are required to officially un-declare their minor with their Academic Advisor prior to graduation.
